The heart of Life For Children Ministry, a 501(c)(3) charity, is to provide family based care for children who have been partially or totally orphaned by the HIV/AIDS epidemic in western Kenya. LCM works diligently to find the closest extended family member, who is willing and able to take the child in and be their guardian. Once placed LCM keeps a close relationship with the guardian and child to ensure the best love and care is being provided. The Street Kids Ministry is another ministry of LCM and is dedicated to feeding boys living in the streets and landfills of Kisumu. Every Sunday a warm meal is provided for these boys with the teachings of Christ. <i>Heart for 100</i> is the Micro-Finance Division of LCM. <i>Heart for 100</i> provides loans to women's groups and individuals to create and run their own small business. Learn more and make an appointment at redcrossblood.org	 Building projects: LCM has built a church, a school, and water wells in areas that did not have access to clean water. House building, especially for widows, is also very important to the ministry. Agricultural initiative: LCM purchased a tractor used by many to increase the harvest, a portion of which is given back to LCM for the feeding program. Education Funding: Partners are needed to continue molding the young minds of Kenya. Classrooms have been built and staffed but more are needed. School fees are also a big part of orphan support. The Mission & Outreach Team supports 15 orphans at \$65/orphan/month, provides monthly funds towards Michael Agwanda's salary, and provides funding for needs
 What has Covenant been doing for Lincoln School? We have * provided monthly treats for the entire staff of 70 * helped Kindergarten teachers with prep work * provided a "breakfast for dinner" for teachers on their parent teacher conference evening * helped the librarian with the Book Fair * provided hats and gloves for students in need * 13 tutors have met with students to help with school work Interested in learning how you can participate?
