 We will be collecting <u>deodorant</u> for those at the Rescue Mission - think what a difference that can make for the self-esteem and health of a homeless person. For men: regular & travel size

2. We will also be collecting <u>financial donations</u> to purchase supplies for a Project 216 meal packing event on Saturday, October 22



- * Project 216 is a Christian organization whose goal is to provide the most nutritious meal possible to reverse the effects of malnutrition. Every 6 seconds a child dies from hunger related causes. By providing money to purchase meal ingredients/supplies and helping to package the meals in October YOU can make a difference!
- * It only takes \$.30 to pay for the ingredients of one meal \$25 = 83 meals, or \$50 = 166 meals, or \$100 = 333 meals
- * The number of meals we pack will depend on the donations we receive thru this offering

* This year Covenant will be sending the food we package to Haiti thru "Mission of Hope" and to Inasmuch Ministry in Fort Wayne.

Did vou know....

- ⇒ 842 million people in the world today do not get enough to eat to live healthy, active lives. That's 1 in 8.
- ⇒ Growth in 1 in 4 children around the world is stunted. In some countries, as many as 1 in 3 children has stunted growth.
- ⇒ In developing countries, 1/3 of all child deaths are linked to hunger.
- ⇒ Hunger and malnutrition are the number one risk to health worldwide greater than AIDS, malaria, and TB combined.

The name Project 216 has three different meanings:

- 1. The first and most basic is that every Project 216 box that gets shipped out contains 216 meals.
- 2. The second, revolves around the volunteers, at a 2-hour packing event, each volunteer will average about 216 meals.
- 3. And third, as a Christian organization, we serve because Jesus came to serve. James 2:16 says, "If one of you says to those in need, "Go in peace, keep warm and well fed" but does nothing about their physical needs, what good is it?"

Project 216 is a 501c3 non-profit humanitarian food aid organization. Meals are packaged by local volunteers and delivered to those in need with the help of worldwide partners, non-government organizations around the world who are working hands-on with those in need. The program cost, which covers food, shipping, and overhead, comes out to \$0.30 per meal.

News from Mason & Claire Miller (rec'd June 22, 2022)

Adventure's There is a great movie on Netflix called "About Time" where the protagonist has the ability to time travel. He spends the majority of the movie going back and reliving amazing moments: his first kiss, first date, the day his child was

born. At the end of the movie, he says that he started traveling back 24 hours and reliving each day but not changing anything; simply re-experiencing each day with the foreknowledge of what would happen, but this time, he opens his eyes to the beauty around him, slowing down to see goodness that he had missed the first time.



But then, he takes it one step further. The actor says: "The truth is I now don't travel back at all; not even for the day. I just try to live every day as if I've deliberately come back to this day to enjoy it, as if it was the final day of my extraordinary, ordinary life. We are all traveling through time, together, every day of our lives. All we can do is do our best to relish this remarkable life."

Relish. Right now. Pause. Breathe in. Look around: goodness everywhere. Suffering? Of course. But I'm sure, if you're like me, that if you actually paused and looked back, you would see a whole bunch of beauty from the ashes.

Here's what I've come to know: when I look back through difficult seasons, if I look hard enough, I'm sure to walk away with a sense of God's faithfulness. With perspective. With gratitude.

The other day, we had outdoor church and we sat with our small group. As I looked down the line, I remembered prayer requests each person had throughout the year and was able to see how God had answered them. In the middle of people searching for jobs and getting rejected; in the middle of difficult pregnancies; in the middle of marriage struggles, it felt hard. Broken. Ugly. Desperate. But now, we can look back and see how God showed up for each of these people in beautiful ways and was faithful to hear their prayers, walk with them in the uncertainty + waiting periods, and bring beauty from their ashes.

Fundraising has given us the opportunity to reflect with people from all our different seasons of life (family friends, high school friends, college, youth group, camp ministry, past students, and family) and recall the goodness of God. To relish in the friends he has woven together through our lives. We have loved reminiscing with people about how God used us or them to create change in each other. Fundraising, while a difficult experience at times, has provided us the opportunity to look back over our ministry in Kenya from 2018-2020 and see those "goodness of God moments." We are grateful to have the perspective to see God's provision, protection, wisdom, love, and grace. When we look back, we can see how kids became more wise, better leaders, more forgiving, fostered better relationships with their families, and came to understand God's love and call on their lives.

We are honored to be just a few months away from heading back to continue pouring into these students. This time around, I don't want to wait to see God's goodness until we are two years post ministry. I want to slow down and relish in his goodness. To soak in the ordinary but extraordinary moments. To live with eyes wide open to the beauty around me.

Thank you so much for praying us through this fundraising process! We have crossed the 80% mark--hallelujah! We are seeking 12 more monthly partners to reach our target goal. Our goal is to be at 100% by July 20th. This month we are going to buy flights which makes it all the more real. Thank you for praying for our hearts as we both rejoice in being able to return to Kenya after 2 years and grieve saying goodbye to our friends and family. We are grateful for you, our community, and we relish in the goodness of God weaving our stories together.

Caleb and Amy Cox's Adventures in Ministry with Cru June 2022 Prayer Letter

June 7-11, we took 19 students to Estes Park, Colorado for CruRocky22", a leadership camp. We joined about 50 other Cru students from 5 other cities across the country. The biggest way God impacted the guys we brought from Plano was teaching them how to be vulnerable and bear each other's burdens.



It all started during a testimony training workshop. The first student shared in his testimony about deep pain from his dad betraying their family. He broke down in tears, and his friends comforted him and wept with him. His story set the tone for the rest of the group. One by one, the others opened up and shared about some of the hardest moments in their lives, including deaths of close family members and current struggles with depression and suicidal thoughts.

When we debriefed the day together, the guys from that table talked about how surprised they were to hear the things shared that morning. They are all on the football team and spend a lot of time together. But they had no idea the depth of the pain that they each carried. They

described how good it felt to be honest with each other about the hurt in their lives, support each other and know they're not along. "Society tells us to be tough and keep our emotions inside. But it was such a relief to be open with each other. We're so much closer now," one of the explained.

I know how you feel because I once felt the same way. But if we all think that way, nobody will do anything, and nothing will change. Although our individual efforts may not solve the problems, together we can make a major difference. God won't hold us accountable for what we could not do, but He will hold us accountable for the things we could have done.

If we can give one hungry child one meal, it is worth doing. If we can help one person go without pain for one day, it is worth doing. I have resolved to always do what I can do and to remember what God said to me: "If you can only relieve someone's pain one time for one hour, it is still worth doing."

Has God planted an idea or a desire in your heart to help others in a specific way? Trust that whatever you can do is worth doing. Don't let the magnitude of the problem overwhelm you. God will show you what you can do—trust Him when He says it makes a difference."
