Two ways to help feed the hungry! Meet the Need and Meat the Need!

1. MEET THE NEED: Help pack meals at Covenant's Project 216 Food Packing Event
Saturday, November 8 from 8:30-noon or earlier
Signup now at the Welcome Desk or at Covenantumc.net

Where the name "Project 216" comes from:

- ⇒ Every box that is shipped contains **216 meals**.
- ⇒ Every 2 hours each volunteer will pack an average of **216 meals** designed to help the hungry thrive.
- ⇒ **James 2:16** "If one of you says to those in need, 'Go in peace, keep warm and well fed' but does nothing about their physical needs, what good is it?"

Each meal provides all the vitamins and minerals a child needs for a day. The food Covenant packs on November 8 will be sent to Mission of Hope in Haiti and to Inasmuch Ministry in Fort Wayne.

We need 120 people to help with the packing. All ages are encouraged to participate (children younger than 7 should be accompanied by an adult). Child care will be available for very young children.

Signups are required to allow set up of enough assembly lines. Hair nets will be provided or wear a ball cap.

CHANGES ARE COMING TO THE WAY MISSIONS WILL BE FINANCED IN 2026!

Up until 2026 the Mission Team was allotted funds from Covenant's Operating Fund (a portion of your annual pledge to Covenant) to establish a budget from which they could support various ministries as the team decided.



In 2025 the Mission Team budget from Covenant's Operating Fund is \$20,200 and has been used to help support: Inasmuch Ministry - \$4,800; Life for Children Ministry Orphans - \$2,400; Missionaries (Millers, Cox, and Agwanda) - \$11,700; Rising Stars (Lincoln School projects) - \$1,000; Administrative Costs \$300

Beginning in 2026 the Mission Team will no longer receive a portion of the church's Operating Fund.

To support the work of the Mission Team you will be asked to complete a Faith Promise Giving Commitment Card to further God's work in missions as God leads you and provides for you.

Your Faith Promise Giving will provide funds to continue support of local and international ministries and missionaries not funded by Special Offerings for example: Inasmuch Ministries, Forgotten Stones, Food Bank, UMCOR, Life for Children Ministry Projects & Orphans, Missionaries (Cox's & Agwanda), Rising Stars, etc.

What won't change?

- Donations can still be made to designated ministries
- Special offerings (Lenten Offering for Project 216, UMCOR Sunday and Christmas Offering).





- * limited financial assistance for housing and utilities
- * housing & eviction concerns
- * a food bank clients can visit every 14 days for food, household items and hygiene items
- * a clothing closet with a wide variety of clothing in all sizes clients may visit every 14 days
- * local bus passes for job searches and medical appointments
- * birth certificate and marriage license recovery

Inasmuch Ministry began more than 30 years ago when Broadway Christian Church's secretary began sharing her lunch with people in need.

Located at 930 Broadway in Fort Wayne, Inasmuch Ministry is open Mondays (9-11, 5-7), Wednesdays (9-11) and Fridays (9-11).

Volunteers are always needed in the Food Bank and Clothing Closet, along with volunteers to meet with clients, and a variety of other jobs. There are many ways you can volunteer.

- * Circles of Allen County to those who desire to break the cycle of generational poverty with classes, mentors, and connections
- * a Representative Payee, who administers the funds of a person who is unable to responsibly manage their money.
- * a Day Shelter at 930 Broadway on Tuesdays & Thursdays from 8-11 for anyone who wants a safe place to rest with activities if they desire.
- * coming soon: job services & housing portfolios

Forgotten Stones is a new ministry that grew from Mary Ann Mings, director of Inasmuch Ministry, seeing other needs for the homeless and wanting to help them improve their situation.

Forgotten Stones uses the Inasmuch Ministry building on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 8-11 for their Day Shelter. They are actively looking for their own building in the downtown area.

Volunteers needed to spend time with those that come to the Day Shelter and to provide hot meals. (see page 4). Monetary donations are also needed.

Two Programs of Associated Churches Which Help Families and Have Volunteer Opportunities For YOU!

<u>Journey Beside Mothers</u> provides free assistance to mothers in need of support to help them grow as individuals and raise emotionally healthy families.



Journey Beside Mothers Programs:

- Playgroup meets in the afternoons on the 1st & 3rd Wednesday
- * Great Moms Club meets on the 2nd & 4th Wednesday evening. The moms meet for dinner and a time of enrichment, support and fun which allows them time to grow relationships.
- * 1-on-1 mentoring for interested mothers. Mentors receive training and are then matched with a mom
- * Nurse visits for pregnant moms through the child's 1st birthday.
- * Mentors in the FWCS if the mom is a student (parenting or pregnant) to provide additional support to help students stay engaged in school and to surround them in a supportive community.

Volunteer Opportunity ~ Childcare help for newborns - age 6 for Great Moms Club

- The 2nd & 4th Wednesday of every month from 5:45-7:30
- ♦ A background check is required and anyone ages 16+ is welcome to volunteer.

<u>A Baby's Closet</u> helps families experiencing hardships by providing essential baby items to safely and adequately care for their children. The program provides a unique opportunity to earn coupons which can be redeemed for clothing, car seats, and baby supplies.



Life For Children Ministry, a 501(c)(3) charity, provides many ways for people in Wachara and Kisumu, Kenya to improve their lives ...

- ⇒ **Construction**: improving living conditions helps the many that are without; school facilities, water wells, widows' homes, greenhouses.
- ⇒ Sustainable agriculture methods: greenhouses, goats and chickens are distributed to help with food supply, services like plowing and corn milling are provided
- ⇒ **Microfinance loans**: support women in business
- ⇒ **Street kids**: cared for weekly with meals and The Word
- ⇒ Education: to enable bigger opportunities

BUT Life for Children's Ministry's primary concern is providing a family-based care system for children orphaned by the HIV/AIDS epidemic in western Kenya. It is estimated there are 1.1 million children in Kenya who have been orphaned due to HIV/AIDS alone. The ministry works with local churches, schools, and trusted community members to identify the most vulnerable of these children.

Click here for a video that explains the orphan program by Michael Agwanda, founder and leader of Life for Children Ministry. The video is dated but what Michael shares is still true today though the number of orphans supported by the ministry has increased to over 300 orphans.

Your orphan support will provide food, clothing, education, school uniforms, medical care and spiritual nourishment. Donate any amount to Covenant, indicating "Orphan Support" and your donation will be sent to the ministry for orphan support.
