# Questions and answers about funding Missions through Faith Promise Giving:

⇒ What is Faith Promise Giving?

Faith Promise Giving is a way of systematically supporting Covenant's mission efforts. Ask God how much you should give to missions over the next year and trust Him to supply that amount.



# ⇒ Is Faith Promise Giving a part of your tithe?

Faith Promise Giving is not a part of your tithe - it is giving over and above the tithe. Tithe money runs the church and its ministries. Faith Promise is given specifically for missions.

⇒ Does Faith Promise Giving cover giving that happens in times of great need or compassion?

No, during times of unusual need giving is over and above Faith Promise Giving.

#### ⇒ Does Faith Promise Giving cover more than giving to missions?

No, the funds received through Faith Promise are not used for Covenant's operating costs. All Faith Promise money is used to support ministries and missionaries as decided by the Mission Team.

# ⇒ Is Faith Promise Giving biblical?

Yes, it is a purely biblical basis of giving - by FAITH. See Proverbs 11:24-25, Luke 6:38, I Corinthians 16:1-2, II Corinthians 8:1-5; 8:10 and 9:7-10, Romans 12:9-10; Hebrews 11:1.

# ⇒ How do you get the funds to fulfill your Faith Promise?

First and foremost, in prayer ask God what he wants you to give and then trust Him to provide the funds. He may increase your income or decrease your expenses or lead you to sacrifice.

# ⇒ Can you use your Required Minimum Distribution towards Faith Promise Giving?

Yes, your investment counselor can help you with making this transfer of funds.

#### ⇒ Can you make a donation any time of the year to Faith Promise without completing a pledge card?

Yes, when you feel God has placed on your heart to give to Faith Promise (missions) we encourage you to give with joy. You do not need to fill out a Commitment Card to give to Faith Promise.

#### ⇒ Can you give to Designated Accounts, naming a specific ministry you want your funds to go to?

Yes, you can give to designated accounts, but be sure to indicate where you want your money to go.

#### ⇒ Will there still be special offerings taken during the year?

Yes, there will three special offerings taken in 2026 ~ a Lenten Offering (to raise funds for a Project 216 Food Packing Event), an UMCOR Sunday offering (an annual gift to fund UMCOR administrative costs) and a Christmas Offering (divided between ministries as the Mission Team decides).

#### **⇒** The 4 steps for Faith Promise:

- 1. Pray (ask God to give you and your family the amount He wants you to give to Missions)
- 2. Commit (carry out your commitment, don't give up, trust God)
- 3. Look (for unexpected ways God provides)
- 4. Give (give as God enables you to give) Please return your Faith Promise Giving Commitment Card by Sunday, November 23 so the Mission Team can make plans for 2026

#### ORPHAN SPONSORSHIP ~ ALWAYS THE PRIMARY MISSION

The following is from a Life for Children Ministry Newsletter

"The King will reply, "Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me"." Matthew 25:40 (NIV)

Every day, before the city wakes up, a different kind of morning begins for the countless street boys living on our streets. While others head to school or breakfast tables, these boys are already on the move - not to chase dreams, but to chase survival.

With no family support, no shelter, and often no hope, they wander from one street to another, searching through bins, market leftovers, and dumping sites, trying to find anything edible. This has become their daily routine - not out of choice, but out of desperation.

#### LIFE FOR CHILDREN STREET FEEDING PROGRAM: More Than Just a Meal

In the middle of this struggle, Life for Children Ministry plays a critical and life-saving role. For many of these boys, our feeding program at Arina Social Hall is the only place they can get a hot, clean meal in a day - a break from the hunger that has become their constant companion.

But these programs do more than just feed. They provide:

- \* Dignity: A chance to eat like any other child, seated, served, and respected.
- \* Love and Care: Volunteers and staff offer kindness, sometimes the only positive adult interaction the children receive.

This small window of care can be the first step toward transforming a child's life.

#### THE HARSH REALITY ON THE GROUND

Sadly, even as we work on these programs to make a difference, local governments often take the opposite route. Instead of helping us to support these vulnerable children and street families they are instead treated like criminals. They are forcefully removed from towns often without any plans for their welfare or future. Chasing street children away without addressing why they are on the streets is like cutting weeds without removing the roots. Poverty, abuse, hunger, broken homes are the real reasons children end up on the streets. And until those are addressed, street boys will keep returning, hungry and hopeless.

#### WHY SUPPORTING LIFE FOR CHILDREN FEEDING PROGRAMS MATTER

- \* By supporting Life for Children Feeding Programs, we are not just giving food we are saving lives.
- \* We are helping keep children alive long enough for them to have another chance.
- \* We are creating opportunities for trust and intervention.
- \* We are also building up with the Word of God and hope and love of our savior Jesus Christ.

#### Another way Life for Children Ministry is helping ~ 100 SHEEP WERE DISTRIBUTED TO FARMERS!

100 Sheep Distributed to Ndhiwa Farmers LCM distributed 100 sheep to farmers in the local community. The venture into sheep rearing is intended to help the farmers grow economically. Each group received a mature female indigenous sheep. The participants agree to donate the first off spring to another member and remains with the mother until every member gets a sheep. The sheep were distributed to the farmers at St. Antony Wachara Christian School in Kwabwai Ward. The farmers have been interested in rearing sheep for some time but lacked the capital to start and were very appreciative of this contribution. The goal of the initiative is to enable the farmers to eventually buy cattle. It is expected that every group member will have sheep in five years or less.

# **UMCOR (United Methodist Committee on Relief) Disaster Responses**

UMCOR

Gaza Crisis - The need in Gaza remains overwhelming. UMCOR is actively responding to the humanitarian crisis by awarding grants to local partners in Israel, Gaza and the surrounding region. Partners are using funds for relocation support; food & hygiene kits for internally displaced people; support of students & their continued learning; psychosocial treatment and trauma counseling to women & children; delivery of medical supplies; and more.

Hurricane Helene devastated parts of the southeastern U.S. UMCOR is coordinating with affected annual conferences & supporting their local relief efforts. UMCOR has awarded solidarity grants to North Georgia, Sout Georgia, Western North Carolina & Holston annual conferences. Also, UMCOR-trained Early Response Teams are coordinating efforts to support the removal of debris, tarping of roofs, and cleaning out of homes in hard-hit areas.

**Texas Flooding** - On July 4, 2025 historic rain levels led to catastrophic flash flooding and hundreds of deaths along the Guadalupe River in Central Texas. UMCOR awarded a solidarity grant to the Rio Texas Annual Conference to support immediate relief efforts. The grant provides relief to those impacted through Early Response Team deployment, debris removal, distribution of relief supplies and more.

Ongoing 2022-2025 Ukraine War - Since the invasion of Ukraine by Russian forces, UMCOR has acted on behalf of The United Methodist Church to provide aid and assistance. Grants for immediate relief have been given to trusted partners – United Methodist churches in surrounding countries, ecumenical partners and non-governmental organizations – to provide direct aid inside Ukraine as well as help for those who have fled to surrounding countries.

#### How can you help? Donate - 100% of your donation goes directly to disaster response.

Your gift could be used to deliver essential supplies like food and water; support the removal of debris; or provide temporary shelter for the displaced.


