THE CORE VALUES OF THE MISSION & OUTREACH TEAM

Every decision we make - how we spend our time, our money, our energy - is based on the values that we hold most dear. Covenant's Mission & Outreach Team, with the help of studying the scriptures and referencing books such as *When Helping Hurts* and *Toxic Charity*, identified the key values that guide and direct its decisions.

We believe ...

... everyone is called to serve. As stated in John 13:14-15, Jesus modeled serving others throughout his entire ministry. We believe all those who follow Jesus are mandated to serve. We believe this helps us grow as disciples of Jesus Christ. We will therefore provide the resources and tools so that everyone at Covenant: children, youth, and adults are equipped to serve.

... the best way to make disciples is by living out our faith with a servant attitude. Based on James 2:18, we will encourage all those in the Covenant community to share the Good News of the gospel through active servanthood, prayer, and faith sharing relationships.

... that in serving we are called to do no harm. Based on John Wesley's, Three Simple Rules for Christian Living, "Do no harm, Do good, Stay in love with God", we believe that our service should empower people towards lives of self-sufficiency. Therefore we will first determine what is appropriate; supporting and/or funding relief efforts, rehabilitation and/or development as each situation requires.

... we are called to serve the poor and the marginalized locally, nationally, and globally. In Matthew 25:40, Jesus calls us to serve "the least of these". We will therefore serve and support ministries that work with the poor and marginalized.

... we are called together to be the church to make a greater impact on the world. Realizing the impact of the first church in Acts 2:42-47, we will follow their example and prayerfully seek guidance on how best to use the resources entrusted to us. Therefore, while we will encourage all people to serve individually, the Mission & Outreach Team will concentrate their efforts and encourage the Covenant community to focus on 4 specific ministries as a community (Life for Children Ministry, Inasmuch Ministry, Forgotten Stones Ministry, and Lincoln Elementary School).

... we were created to partner with God. Although use of our time, energy, and money reflects our commitment, we are not limited by the lack of these because God has all the time, energy, and money God needs. Therefore, we will prayerfully consider any ministry opportunity presented to us, not limiting ourselves based on our own understanding.

In addition, the team has defined its primary objective:

"Empowering servants and transforming the world
by targeting children and poverty."

- * **GIFTS FOR BYRON WELLNESS COMMUNITY RESIDENTS:** Wish lists from 25 residents, many who are lonely and forgotten at Christmas, were filled. Thank you to Peg & Steve Roser for leading this project.
- * **FOOD BANK COLLECTION:** "Share the Feast" ~ Your many donations were packed in bags and given to those at the Food Bank who also received a turkey to make a complete meal for the holiday.

- * **GIFTS FOR CHILDREN OF THE CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocates) PROGRAM:** 126 Gifts and 17 gift cards were purchased and delivered to make Christmas special for 21 children in 9 families. Thank you to Julie Hyndman and her helpers for leading this project.

Four Ministry Focuses of Covenant's Mission & Outreach Team

1. **Lincoln Elementary School:** Covenant shares Jesus' love by helping, supporting, and caring for the students, staff and families of Lincoln.
2. **Inasmuch Ministry of Fort Wayne:** helps people in need by offering hope through a relationship with Jesus Christ and promotes personal responsibility. See page 4.
3. **Forgotten Stones:** a ministry in Fort Wayne whose focus is to make the homeless known by providing Circles of Allen County, a Representative Payee, a Day Shelter and care and love for the homeless. See an update on page 5.
4. **Life for Children Ministry in Kenya:** provides housing, health care, education, food and spiritual nourishment for orphans of HIV/Aids, and more for those in need. See Christmas greetings on page 5.

Thank you to Sisters of the Heart, a group of 14 women at Covenant.

During their Christmas luncheon Sisters of the Heart held a baby shower for Associated Churches' "A Baby's Closet" and had a "show & tell" of baby items they had purchased. They stuffed a large tote with blankets, outfits, baby bottles, baby towels plus a case of baby wipes (with a value of \$286) and collected \$90. These were all delivered to "A Baby's Closet" and were much appreciated.

Join us in praying for a miracle please. And if no miracle, we trust God is still good & loving & can bring hope and peace there too. But selfishly this mom heart feels like it's been through too much & would love to just have the miracle, k? 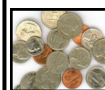

This year, Fort Wayne continues to navigate heartbreaking levels of youth violence. Yet in the middle of this challenge, something extraordinary is growing: young leaders are choosing nonviolence, survivors are finding community and healing, and schools are creating safer, more connected environments.



- **Hundreds of students** in every FWCS high schools are receiving nonviolent leadership development through the Peacemaker Initiative.
- **Youth in crisis** are finding a safe, supportive place in the Peace Rooms at their high schools, where conflict turns into reconciliation.
- **Families who have lost loved ones to homicide** are not left to navigate their grief alone - they receive support through groups, care, and connection.

Fort Wayne Community School Clothing Bank
Making room for new clothes received this Christmas?



The FWCS Clothing Bank (1511 Catalpa St.) would appreciate any donations of clothing, in good clean condition, to be able to provide clothing to thousands of students and their families in need this year. Students and their families receive clothes, shoes, coats, toiletries and other items as needed because of poverty or homelessness or following a disaster such as a flood or fire. Students are referred to the clothing bank by a case manager or counselor at their school. The Clothing Bank operates with the support of monetary donations and donations of new and gently used clothing.

List of needed items:

Personal hygiene products (must be NEW): soap, shampoo/conditioner, toothpaste & toothbrushes, tampons & pads, brushes/combs, hair accessories, bodywash, deodorant (spray & stick), lotion

Clothing (new or gently used): clothing (sizes 4T- adult plus); boots/shoes (children & adult sizes); coats; hats; gloves/mittens; NEW socks (all sizes); NEW underwear (all sizes); NEW bras/sports bras (all sizes)

Inasmuch Ministry “Truly I say to you, in as much as you did it to one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did it to me.” — Matthew 25:40



What does Inasmuch Ministry provide to those who come to them for help?

- ⇒ **Food:** the food bank is open to anyone for food, household items, and hygiene assistance. Clients may visit every 14 days.
- ⇒ **Clothing:** Inasmuch has a large variety of clean, gently worn, and new clothing available in all sizes. Anyone may visit the Clothing Closet every 14 days. Donations of clothing are much appreciated.
- ⇒ **Local Bus Passes:** for job searches and medical appointments. Monthly local bus passes are available at a reduced rate for senior citizens and individuals on disability.
- ⇒ **Recovery of Lost Identification:** birth certificate and marriage license recovery.
- ⇒ **Limited financial assistance for housing and utilities:** individuals must visit their township trustee first for an action letter before coming to Inasmuch for financial help. Certain criteria must be met before assistance will be offered. Financial assistance is available once a year.
- ⇒ **Housing & Eviction Concerns:** a case manager from Just Neighbors is available to discuss concerns.
- ⇒ **Love, kindness, acceptance and the hope and salvation of Jesus Christ for all who enter their doors**

An example of how Inasmuch is touching and changing lives from Mary Ann Mings on Sunday, Dec. 14:

“One of our clients, has been coming for about a year. He is a different faith than us, but is always respectful when we pray or talk about Jesus. At first, he was a little skeptical of us, but over time, has been a huge supporter of us. Brittney helped him in finding a new job. His employer told me that when they asked him about IAM, “he lit up”. They said he told them how much he loves us, and is going to be teaching personal defense training for us.”

Covenant’s Mission Team will be donating to Inasmuch Ministry from your Faith Promise Giving.

Dear Friends at Covenant United Methodist Church,

Here is an update for our various programs within the Forgotten Stones organization:



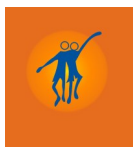
- ⇒ **Day Shelter:** Over 175 individuals have been through the doors of the Day Shelter for Unhoused Individuals since the beginning of the summer. This is in spite of the 24/7 warming shelters that have been open since December 1. People continue to come to this Day Shelter because they are loved and accepted here. This has become their safe place for two mornings a week.
- ⇒ **Employment Opportunities:** Three individuals have found employment with the Grand Wayne Center. Of the six gentlemen we have helped find employment, at least two are up for promotions.
- ⇒ **Housing for the Unhoused:** Forgotten Stones continues to place the unhoused into boarding houses or apartments. At least one of our couples has even moved on to an apartment from the boarding house and another couple is saving up their money so that they can do the same thing.
- ⇒ **Representative Payee Program:** This program continues to grow and we will soon be up to 10 clients. One client who had been in debt for quite some time when he began the program, will be debt free by the end of February.
- ⇒ **Circles of Allen County:** The Circle Leaders are almost finished with their training and have been matched with their Allies. Budgets have been completed, and weekly tracking of income and expenses has begun. The Leaders are now working towards meeting their goals of saving \$1,000 and becoming debt free among other personal goals. One of our Circle Leaders completed her GED and will soon begin welding classes.

Donations to Faith Promise Giving will be used to help support Forgotten Stones.

In the midst of constantly changing Federal guidelines and funding resources, we ask for your prayers for more church and individual supporters so that we can continue with this work to help those who are most vulnerable in our community. Thank you for your continued support and for your recent gifts totaling \$925.

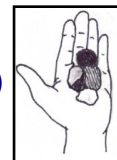

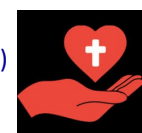
